#### **AFFINITY FOR:**

lymphatic system, skin, joints, liver meridian, crown chakra, yin energy

#### THERAPEUTIC PROPERTIES:

anti-inflammatory, anti-rheumatic, tonic, astringent, lymphatic cleanse

#### **AROMATIC CONSIDERATIONS:**

The aroma of Katrafay essential oil is "earthy" with a green, mossy scent. The pale yellow liquid blends well with Lavender, Tea Tree, Rosemary, Clary Sage, Nutmeg, Lemon and Marjoram.

#### **APPLICATION:**

Katrafay should be diluted well and applied to areas of concern.

### **!** CAUTIONS:

Katrafay is generally non-toxic and nonsensitizing. It should be diluted well. Avoid use during pregnancy.

#### **INGREDIENT IN:**

Le Ambition, Le Benediction, Le Delicate, Le Faith, Le Solitude, Le Tomorrow

#### **PHYSICAL ASPECTS:**

The remarkable quality about Katrafay is its high percentage of sesquiterpenes (about 67.5%). Sesquiterpene molecules readily cross the blood/brain barrier. They bring increased amounts of oxygen and healing properties to the central nervous system. The high percentage of sesquiterpenes also makes Katrafay a good fragrance fixative. Katrafay essential oil is indicated for mental fatigue, headaches, sciatica and muscle pains. It is traditionally used in Madagascar after childbirth.
